

**[Scene 1: Interview Set 1]**

Vincent: Good morning, ladies and gentlemen! I'm Vincent Kok. **[Background: Photo of HK Film Awards ceremony]** The 42nd Hong Kong Film Awards ceremony just finished, and we're excited to have some award-winning actors here for an interview. Let's welcome Rachel Leung and John Chiang Tai Wai, the Best Supporting Actress and Actor! **[Background: Images of the two actors]**  
**[Applause]**

Vincent: First, congratulations to both of you! Rachel, as this year's Best Supporting Actress, how does it feel to be recognized?

Rachel: Thank you! I'm happy because this award is the most important award I've ever received. Over the past ten years, I've learned so much from my fellow colleagues, and finally, they have acknowledged my hard work. **[Whole screen: Poster of "In Broad Daylight" and photo of Mr. Liu Kai Chi]** Without "In Broad Daylight," I'd still be an unknown actress. And big thanks to my mentor, Mr. Liu Kai Chi, who always emphasized the value of persistence!

Vincent: Within the "In Broad Daylight" team, who would you like to thank the most?

Rachel: I want to thank Jennifer Yu, the Best Actress this year! In the film, I played a character with intellectual disabilities. Because of the pandemic, I could not meet residents in person. I had to rely on documentaries to prepare for the role. **[Whole screen: Clip of Rachel biting Jennifer's hair]** I observed that they were curious about special things, and for Jennifer, it was her long hair! So, I

asked for her permission to bite her hair before filming that scene. After the movie came out, some people even thought I was really disabled! I'm thankful for Jennifer's cooperation!

Vincent: Thank you! Rachel! Now, let's turn to John Chiang. With over 70 years in the industry and winning the Best Supporting Actor award this year, how do you feel?

John: First, I want to thank my wife for her nonstop support! Honestly, I never expected to win an award. I started as a child star at four years old and developed a passion for acting. **[Whole screen: Photo of the three brothers]** My good brothers Chun-Pui and Derek Yee officially launched my career. Acting has its ups and downs, just like what Rachel mentioned. During the filming of "Street Children", **[Whole screen: Poster of "Street Children" and Photo of Director Griffin Yueh Feng]** there was a tense scene: I thought I had captured the nervousness, but Director Mr. Yueh corrected me—I was smiling when I shouldn't have been! He even gave me a slap! **[Image of a slap]** Although it felt unfair at the time, I realized that the persistence of learning from failure is important. Now, as an old actor, I hope to pass on the spirit of persistence, especially the kind that keeps us going despite setbacks.

Vincent: Thank you both for joining us! Now, let's hand things over to Ms. DoDo for the next part of our interview with this year's Best Actor and Actress!

## [Scene 2: Interview Set 2]

DoDo: Hi there, everyone! Standing next to me are Jennifer Yu Heung Ying and Tony Leung Chiu Wai! **[Background: Images of the two actors]** **[Applause]** First, congrats to both of you! Now, let's chat with our Best Actress, Jennifer Yu. Rachel thanked you earlier for letting her bite your hair. Any other thoughts you'd like to share?

Jennifer: Thanks, Ms DoDo! Back in 2018, I went through a tough time because of a breakup. I even thought about quitting acting. But my persistence and my love for acting kept me going. Special thanks to Director Mr. Kan **[Whole screen: Poster of "In Broad Daylight" and Photo of Kan Kwan Chun]** for giving me this chance. Even after getting married and having kids, I wasn't sure if I should retire, but he invited me to audition. And it wasn't just me—I had a whole team supporting me, including the director and the whole movie team. Moreover, my husband **[Whole screen: Photo of her husband]** helped with the kids during the day and studied lines with me at night!

DoDo: Jennifer, congrats once again! Now, let's welcome our Best Actor, Tony Leung Chiu Wai! Many winners talked about persistence. Do you think your success this time is related to persistence too?

Tony: Sure! First, big thanks to my wife **[Whole screen: Image of his wife]**—she's my manager and persistently finds roles for me. Second, thanks to the whole team behind "The Goldfinger" **[Whole screen: Trailer clip of "The**

**Goldfinger”]** for letting me act. Third, for every movie, I need to be well prepared. This persistence of preparation is the most important value of my career. In my next movie “Silent Friend” **[Whole screen: Poster of “Silent Friend”]**, I play as a brain doctor. Even though I had zero knowledge in biology, I read books and interviewed brain doctors from different Hong Kong universities for eight months. Let’s keep that persistence going!
