- ☺ 3: What can we do to solve the problem of desertification? Give two suggestions.

Each F.2 student is required to answer at least one question (i.e. Question 1). For each question answered, the student can get a stamp on **English iDo Pass**. Students who are able to get THREE stamps by answering all three questions can get a candy.

Afforestation

- We can plant more trees and vegetation to stop desertification.

Develop renewable energy

- Cutting trees for fuel wood causes desertification. Therefore, we can develop renewable/ environmentally-friendly energy sources, such as wind, solar and hydroelectric power to substitute for fuel wood.

Pass laws to restrict cutting trees
