Talking about Sports Day (Athletics Meet)

The school is having its Sports Day with all the students at the sports ground. Plenty of students are **taking part**. They are the **competitors**. Others are not taking part. They are the **spectators**. There are also some **officials** who are helping to organize the sports.

There are various events. Some take place in the middle of the field. Others take place on the track around the edge of the field. Field events and track events often take place simultaneously. In each event, there are competitors. Sometimes, there are groups or teams of competitors.

Sports which take place on the track and the field are called **athletics**. Athletes wear shorts, shirts and running shoes. In the **100-metre** race, the **sprinters** are all at the **starting-line**. The starter holds up his gun. At the **finishing-line**, the **judge** and the **time-keepers** are standing ready. "On your marks... Get set...Go!" The **starter fires his gun** and the **race** begins. The competitors run along the track as fast as they can. The spectators shout and **cheer** loudly.

'Inter' means 'between'. An inter-house competition is a competition between houses. An inter-school competition is a competition between schools. And an international competition is a competition between countries (e.g. Olympics, World Cup).

The athletes who come first(champion), second (first-runner-up) and third (second-runner-up) in each event usually win a prize. There are often team or house prizes, form prizes and other special prizes too. They may win a medal(gold, silver or bronze), a cup, a trophy, a shield or a pennant. They get points for their house. The winning house is the one with the most points, the one with the highest score. Everyone is watching the score-board closely.

The sports are usually over by 4pm. It is time for the **prize-giving** (prize presentation). The Principal (or the **Guest of Honour**) delivers a speech and **presents** the prizes, including the Inter-house Cups and the Individual Champions for each **grade**. The winners step onto the stand to **receive** the prizes. All the schoolmates clap and cheer loudly. They **applaud** all the winners.
