Characters:

(Scene 1: Marcus and Julia are walking together in a street in ancient Rome.)

Marcus: (excitedly) Julia, have you heard about the upcoming Roman festival?

Julia: (curiously) No, what is it about?

Marcus: (enthusiastically) It's a celebration of our great Roman culture! There will be chariot races, gladiator fights, and even performances in the theatre.

Julia: (impressed) Wow, that sounds amazing! Where will it be held?

Marcus: (proudly) It'll be held at the Colosseum, the great arena where our brave gladiators fight for glory.

Julia: (excitedly) I've never been to the Colosseum! Can we go together?

Marcus: (happily) Of course! Let's go tomorrow. (Julia: YES!)

(Scene 2: Augustus and Flavius are talking to each other at the Colosseum the next day.)

Augustus: (impatiently) Flavius, when will the festival start? I'm eager to see the gladiators in action.

Flavius: (calmly) Be patient, Augustus. The festival will start soon enough. We have to make sure everything is prepared for the people to worship at the temples before the entertainment begins.

Augustus: (nodding) I understand. It's just that I've heard so much about the gladiator fights. I'm excited to see them myself.

(Flavius nods and walks away.)

(Scene 3: Maximus is getting ready for the fight at the arena.)

Romanus: This is it.

Maximus: The moment we've been waiting for.

Maximus: Me too.

Maximus & Romanus: Let's go for it!

(The crowd cheers as the gladiators enter the arena. The fight begins, and Romanus wins.)

(Scene 4: Marcus and Julia are now at the public bath hall)

Julia: (contentedly) This is so relaxing. I can see why the Romans love the public baths.

Marcus: (nodding) It's a great way to unwind after a long day. I'm glad we came here.

Julia: (curiously) Marcus, why did the Romans spend so much money on sports and entertainments?

Marcus: (thoughtfully) I think it's because the Romans believed in enjoying life to the fullest. Sports and entertainments were a way for them to have fun and forget about their problems, even if it was just for a little while.

Julia: (smiling) I see. Well, I had a lot of fun at the festival today. Thank you for bringing me along, Marcus.
