
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Theme: Global Warming and environmental issue

And stop releasing methane,


This World might be able to sustain!

Activity 3: Writing definitions

A definition is an explanation of the meaning of a word and a phrase. Definitions can be found in dictionaries and other reference books. Here are some tips for writing definitions.



- 1. Start with a simple DESCRIPTION of the issue using a noun
 - For long-term problem, we use words like condition, state, problem, etc.
 E.g. Drink-driving is the problem of driving a vehicle while under the influence of alcohol
 - For things that change, we can use nouns like change, increase, decrease, etc.
 E.g. An economic recession is a decrease in the growth of an economy.
- 2. Give some DETAILS about the issue you want to define
 - State WHO the issue affects.

E.g. Drug addiction affects young people more than the elderly.

- Write WHEN or where THE ISSUE IS MOST NOTABLE.
 E.g. Unemployment is worst during an economic recession
- Say WHY the issue happens.

E.g. War is often caused by a group wanting to take resources, power or land from another group.

Activity 5: Signpost Words

What are signpost words?

They are words, phrases or expressions that we use to indicate what we are about to introduce and discuss, for example, a cause, an effect or a solution

1. Signpost words for CAUSES

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- E.g. Obesity happens because people overeat and lack exercise.
- E.g. People are abandoning pets since they cannot afford the time to take care of them.

2. Signpost words for RESULTS

As a result Therefore

- E.g. Some students are bullied by their peers. As a result, they are unwilling to attend school.
- E.g. Poverty is common among the elderly. Therefore, the government must improve the welfare for them.

3. Signpost words for SOLUTIONS

In order to tackle/ solve the problem could improve the situation by

- E.g. In order to tackle/ solve the problem, the government must enforce stricter laws.
- E.g. The government could improve the situation by enforcing stricter laws.
