Our Journey to Geneva

Previous Achievements in iGEM in Paris: A Strong Foundation

Our 2024 project, Antimicrobial Black Soldier Fly Ecoplaster, finished in the top five of high school teams for "Best Education" and "Best Sustainable Development" in the iGEM competition held in Paris. This year, we're pushing ourselves again, exceeding everyone's expectations. We created KAPI.



It is an anti-cancer peptide that may be used with cisplatin to eliminate non-small lung cancer cells. This minimizes cisplatin dosage and side effects. The combination of KAPI, a completely novel anticancer peptide, with cisplatin provides an alternative treatment option for lung cancer. We achieved global top-five rankings in the high school division for both the 'Best Education' and 'Best Model' award categories. Although the competition has ended, our story does not stop there.





A Grand Stage: The 50th International Exhibition of Inventions Geneva

In April, we stepped onto a far grander stage: the 50th International Exhibition of Inventions Geneva at Palexpo. With our new anti-cancer peptide KAPI, designed to synergize with cisplatin against non-small cell lung cancer, we were not just presenting research. We were challenging ourselves to redefine oncology's frontiers—and unexpectedly, Geneva redefined us.

Walking into the exhibition felt like entering the Olympics of innovation. A record 1,043 inventions from 42 countries filled the space. For five days, we explained KAPI's mechanism to a diverse audience—from international judges and curious tourists to brighteyed students. Time and again, visitors lingered at our posters, their fascination evident as they asked detailed questions about peptide synthesis mechanisms or cisplatin synergy. Many explicitly praised our team's genuine passion for translational research, with one Swiss pharmacologist noting, 'It's refreshing to see such ambition in young scientists.'

Engaging with Experts: Masterclasses in Innovation

The dialogues deepened when university students and professors joined the conversation. Graduate researchers dissected our molecular docking simulations, suggesting optimizations for binding affinity assays. A cancer biology professor spent 40 minutes discussing clinical hurdles, urging us to preempt pharmacokinetic challenges early. These interactions weren't merely instructive; they were masterclasses in bridging innovation and application.





Personal Transformation: Growth through Engagement

Beyond technical growth, the relentless engagement transformed us personally. Presenting complex science to strangers daily dissolved our earlier hesitations replacing them with unwavering confidence to articulate, defend, and refine our vision. Each conversation boosted our ability to distill complex concepts into accessible insights.

A Lasting Impact: Balancing Innovation and Wonder

In both Paris and Geneva, science wasn't confined to exhibition halls. It lived in the mathematics of swan wings cutting through water, the chemistry of alpine cheese meeting wine, and the physics of sunlight stretching across the Eiffel Tower. These evenings taught us balance: that relentless innovation needs pauses—for awe, for shared bread, for quiet gazes toward distant peaks. We returned to the lab not just with sharper global minds, but with fuller hearts, reminded that discovery thrives when we honor both rigor and wonder.






Visiting Universities

Your senses play a crucial role during interviews. With your eyes, you can observe the interviewee's facial expressions; with your ears, you can capture important points for your writing; and with your brain, you can formulate instant questions. Thus, being a journalist is no easy task; practical skills are essential.

Alternatively, investigate original sources online and understand the community's reactions. Annie emphasizes the importance of critical thinking, especially in an age rife with misinformation. "Think before you act."
